IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING FERAL CHICKENS IN OUR NEIGHBORHOODS

Feral chickens are a health hazard and nuisance in our communities. These wild birds are descendants of birds that were once in captivity, but are believed, due to windstorms, to have escaped and multiplied, now causing a real challenge for Ohana Navy Family Housing to control them in our neighborhoods.

They create nuisances by foraging in residential areas, crowing at inconvenient hours, posing health concerns with their waste, and agitating household pets. More roaming chickens mean more nuisances. **We would like to request if you find a nest of eggs in your neighborhood or private backyard area to please report its location to Ohana Navy Family Housing so we can remove the eggs.** This is the easiest way to control our feral chicken population. We also request feral chickens not be fed by our Residents.

Please keep in mind that while the chicks are cute, they will grow up and multiply, and 50% of those chicks will become roosters! Please support us in our efforts to reduce feral chicken populations by not feeding birds and reporting nests with eggs. Together we can promote a safer and quieter neighborhood.
